Good Jobs Challenge Grant:

Among the 509 nation-wide applicants, only 32 grants were awarded by EDA. Connecticut was awarded \$23.9M, the largest single grant. These federal funds will be administered by the Office of Workforce Strategy (OWS) and will target in high-demand jobs in four priority sector areas: manufacturing, information technology, healthcare, and biomedicine using the regional sector partnership (RSP) model.
